IMPORTANT DATES

Primary Candidate Filing (Non-Judicial)

December 30, 2021

Thursday, 11:59 pm

Last Day for Candidates to Change Party Affiliation:

No person may be a candidate of a major political party for partisan office in 2022 if he or she changed political affiliation to Democrat or Republican on a Voter Registration Application in Nevada or in any other state after December 30, 2021. (NRS 293.176)

Applications received by mail must be post-marked no later than 12/30/21. Online applications must be submitted prior to 11:59 pm on 12/30/21.

January 2, 2022

Thursday

First Day Independent Candidates May Submit Petition for

Approval: Independent candidates must submit their petition of candidacy to the appropriate filing officer for approval prior to circulating the petition. (NRS 293.200(1)(a))

March 7-18, 2022

Monday-Friday
9:00 am-5:00 pm
(closed Sat.-Sun.)

First Day of Candidate Filing: Period during which non-judicial candidates may file to run for office in 2022. (NRS 293.177(1)(b))

No judicial appointments are scheduled for this election.

March 18, 2022

Friday, 5:00 pm

Last Day for Candidate Name Changes: Last day non-judicial candidates may change how their name appears on the ballot. (NAC 293.081)

March 29, 2022

Tuesday, 5:00 pm

Last Day to Withdraw or Rescind Withdrawal of Candidacy: Last day non-judicial candidates may withdraw their candidacy or rescind withdrawal of candidacy. (NRS 293.202)

Primary Election – June 14, 2022

April 15, 2022

Friday

Opt-Out Deadline for Mail Ballots: The last day for the Office of Elections to receive written or online requests to not receive a mail ballot is 60 days before Election Day. (Sections 3 and 51 of AB321 of the 2021 Legislative Session)

All requests to opt-out, whether written or electronic, must be received by this date.

April 30, 2022

Saturday

Deadline for the Start of Mailing of Military and Overseas Ballots: Mail ballots must be ready for distribution to military and overseas voters no later than 45 days before Election Day. (NRS 293D.320)

May 5, 2022

Thursday

Deadline for the Start of Mailing of Out-of-State Ballots: Mail ballots must be ready for distribution to out-of-state voters no later than 40 days before Election Day. (NRS 293.309(2)(a)(2))

May 17, 2022

Tuesday

Deadline for Standard Registration: The last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration without having to do so on the Secretary of State's website is the fourth Tuesday before Election Day. (NRS 293.560)

May 18-31, 2022

Wednesday-Tuesday

Online Only Extended Standard Registration and Updates (14 Days): Register to vote or update your existing registration online ONLY on the Secretary of State's website. (NRS 293.560(1)(a)(2), NRS 293.560(2), and Section 43 of AB321 revising NRS 293.5837(2))

Individuals who register to vote or update their registration on or after May 26, will NOT be sent a sample ballot for the current election for the new or updated registration. (NRS 293.565(7))

May 23, 2022

Sample Ballots Mailed to all Active Registered Voters: (NRS 293.565(6))

May 25, 2022

Wednesday

Deadline for the Start of Mailing of In-State Ballots: Mail ballots must be ready for distribution to in-state voters no later than 20 days before Election Day. (NRS 293.309(2)(a)(1))

June 10, 2022**

Saturday-Friday

Early Voting (14 Days): Any voter registered in Douglas County (including those who received a mail ballot) may vote at any early voting site within the County.

The Douglas County Community and Senior Center will serve as the main early voting center; however, additional branch locations will be made available throughout the County.

In-Person Same-Day Registration and Updates at Early Voting Sites(14 Days): Any voter may register to vote or update their existing registration in-person at any early voting site within the County.

Requirements for same-day registration:

(New Registrants Only)

- New voters are required to provide a current, valid, and unexpired Nevada Driver's License containing a current Douglas County residential address; a Nevada DMV issued State Identification Card, Nevada DMV Interim Document or Tribal Identification Card. (NRS 293.395)

In addition, all new registrants should be prepared to show additional proof of residency IF none of the required items stated above have a current Douglas County residential address on them (provisions are available for homeless persons). **Please note:** Proof of residency supplements the above required items but does NOT substitute for them.

Voting Requirements for Same-Day Registrants:

All same-day registrants are required to vote by provisional ballot at the early voting site immediately following successful completion of the registration process. Provisional ballots contain all offices and contests that appear on a regular ballot.

Provisional ballots are counted after the voter's registration data has been authenticated and it has been confirmed that no other ballots have been cast by the voter during the election. (NRS 293.5832, 293.5842, and 293.5852)

June 1-14, 2022

Wednesday-Tuesday

Online Same-Day Registration and Updates (14 Days):

Individuals may register to vote or update their existing registration online up until and including Election Day; however, this service is only available using the Secretary of State's website.

Please note that due to the proximity of Election Day, individuals who register or reregister to vote within this timeframe will not receive a mail ballot or mailed sample ballot for the current election for the new or updated registration.

Same-day, online registrants are required to vote in person at any Douglas County early voting site or vote center on or before Election Day.

Requirements for same-day registration:

(New Registrants Only)

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June 14, 2022

Tuesday, Election Day

Postmark Deadline: Voted mail ballots returned through the post office must be postmarked no later than Election Day. (Sections 8 and 56 of AB321 of the 2021 Legislative Session)

In-Person Same-Day Registration and Updates on Election Day:

Individuals may register to vote or update their existing registration in-person at any Election Day vote center of

their choice. Please note that new registrants are required to vote at the vote center after successfully completing the registration process.

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June 18, 2022

Saturday, 5pm

Deadline for Receiving Voted Mail Ballots Returned Through the Post Office: By 5pm on the fourth day after Election Day, the Douglas County Office of Elections must receive your voted mail ballot postmarked no later than Election Day. (Sections 8 and 56 of AB321 of the 2021 Legislative Session)

June 20, 2022

Monday, 5pm

Deadline for Curing Mail Ballot Signature Issues: If a question arises about your signature on the outside of your mail ballot return envelope or if you did not put your signature on the outside of that envelope, the Election Department will notify you using the contact information in your voter registration. You will have until 5pm on the sixth day after Election Day to provide a signature confirmation or an actual signature, as applicable. (Section 11 of AB321 of the 2021 Legislative Session)

September 24, 2022
Saturday

Deadline for the Start of Mailing of Military and Overseas Ballots: Mail ballots must be ready for distribution to military and overseas voters no later than 45 days before Election Day. (NRS 293D.320)

September 29, 2022
Thursday

Deadline for the Start of Mailing of Out-of-State Ballots: Mail ballots must be ready for distribution to out-of-state voters no later than 40 days before Election Day. (NRS 293.309(2)(a)(2))

October 11, 2022
Tuesday

Deadline for Standard Registration: The last day to register to vote or to update your existing registration without having to do so on the Secretary of State's website is the fourth Tuesday before Election Day. (NRS 293.560)

October 19, 2022
Wednesday

Deadline for the Start of Mailing of In-State Ballots: Mail ballots must be ready for distribution to in-state voters no later than 20 days before Election Day. (NRS 293.309(2)(a)(1))

Oct. 22-Nov. 4, 2022
Saturday-Friday

Early Voting (14 Days): Any voter registered in Douglas County (including those who received a mail ballot) may vote at any early voting site within the County.

The Douglas County Community and Senior Center will serve as the main early voting center; however, additional branch locations will be made available throughout the County.

Deadline for Receiving Voted Mail Ballots Returned Through the Post Office: By 5pm on the fourth day after Election Day, the Douglas County Office of Elections must receive your voted mail ballot postmarked no later than Election Day. (Sections 8 and 56 of AB321 of the 2021 Legislative Session)
